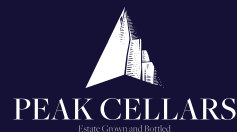

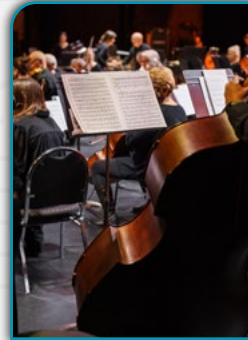

Our **Satellite Series** takes us to new horizons both in repertoire and venues. In *Shift* we examine the new direction that composers took 100 years ago. Shifting from a grand, lush romantic sound, they created works that were fresh, clean and crystalline, like an aural kaleidoscope. In *Amplify*, we move the orchestra another 100 years ahead to our current time where we plug in and amplify voices of our community to share music of our time.

MUSICIANS IN THE MAKING Young musicians from the Kelowna Community Music School, many of whom play in the OSYO or are taught by OSO musicians, perform in the lobby of the Kelowna Community Theatre at our Mainstage Series concerts. Their performances begin at 7:00 pm, and they play for approximately 20 minutes. [Celebrate youth with us!](#)

OPEN DRESS REHEARSALS Scheduled Open Dress Rehearsals at the Kelowna Community Theatre are open to the public to attend. This final working rehearsal before a performance provides opportunities to see the rehearsal process, and to observe how a performance comes together.

There are three Open Dress Rehearsals this season: October 20 at 2:00 pm, February 9 at 1:00 pm, and May 10 at 2:00 pm. All are welcome; admission is by a suggested \$15 donation at the door. teachers and coaches.

Advanced local music students can apply to participate in the masterclasses, while the public is welcome to audit them (admission is by donation at the door). Three masterclasses are offered this season by guest artists: violinist Timothy Chooi (October 22), cellist Anne Jannelle (December 16) and pianist Ian Parker (May 12).

We are also pleased to present two specialized workshops. James Hill will lead a Ukulele workshop on December 16; and OSO Principal Violist Erin Macdonald, (a certified practitioner of the Alexander Technique, a way of learning to move mindfully through life), will present a session on the technique on February 10. GOOD NEWS! As well as the new series described in this brochure, we are also providing new seating arrangements for Mainstage concerts that will make it easier to experience live orchestral music at a savings. Check out pages 14 & 15 for all the details and box office information. Please be aware that for many events, start times have changed, and we are at a number of new venues — pay close attention to the details when you purchase tickets or arrive for a concert. *Embrace the arts with us!*

WHEN TO ARRIVE? An OSO concert starts at the designated time on your ticket. Late arrivees will be asked to wait in the lobby until a suitable break in the music (either the end of a movement or the next work) before entering the auditorium. We encourage you to arrive in plenty of time to be seated prior to the concert start.

WHAT TO WEAR? If uncertainty about what one should wear to a symphony concert is holding you back, we have good news! You are welcome at an OSO concert wearing whatever you are comfortable in — from ripped jeans and T-shirts to suits and ties or gowns. We do also remind you that all OSO venues are **scent-free**.

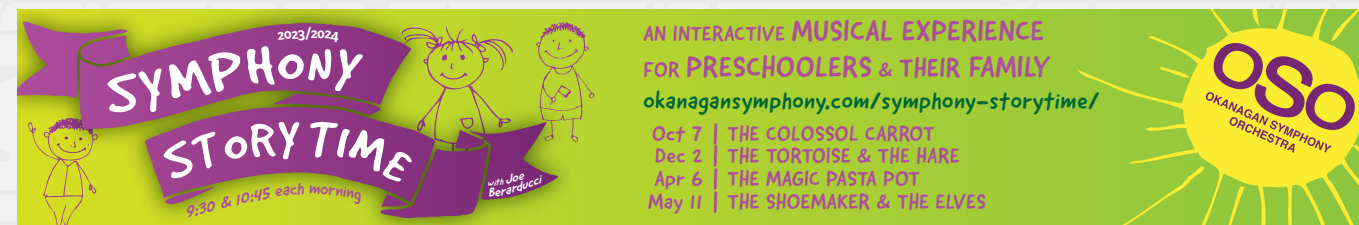

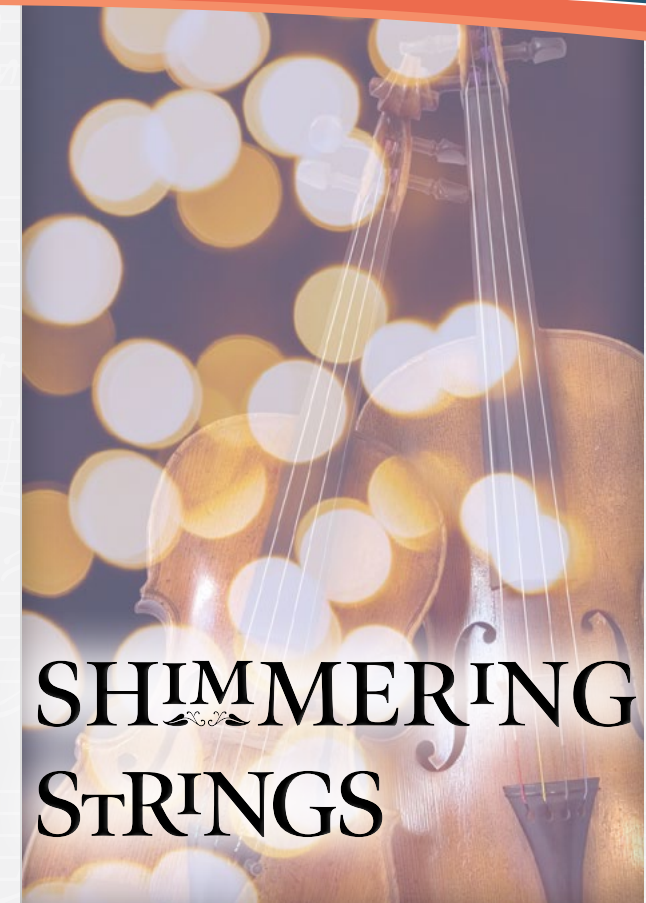

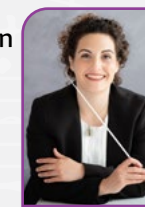

In addition to selections from all eras of the symphonic repertoire, OSYO concerts feature works created by participants in the Student Composition Program, and concerto performances by advanced players. These opportunities contribute to the rigorous orchestral education the OSYO provides its talented young musicians.
