THE MAESTRA

ROSEMARY THOMSON Music Director / OSYO Co-Conductor

A HIGHLY SKILLED MUSICIAN experienced in conducting a wide variety of repertoire with an innovative audience presentation, Rosemary Thomson is currently in her fifteenth season as Music Director of the Okanagan Symphony Orchestra. Under her leadership, the orchestra has blossomed and OSO audiences have grown to unprecedented levels. She has also led the OSO in creating multiple community engagement programs throughout the valley. In 2020, Rosemary also took on the role of Artistic Director for Opera Kelowna. She often shares her passion for music throughout the valley as a guest host, instructor, and writer in schools, colleges, service clubs and through various media channels.

A graduate of the University of Toronto and the Banff Centre for the Arts, Ms. Thomson came to the Okanagan from the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, where she was Resident Conductor and Chorus Master. For four seasons she was Assistant Conductor to Richard Bradshaw for the Canadian Opera Company. She also served as Conductor in Residence for the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, where she was mentored by Maestro Bramwell Tovey. For fourteen seasons she conducted Toronto's new music ensemble Continuum, with whom she toured Canada and Europe and recorded several CDs of music by Canadian composers.

Ms. Thomson has been active as a guest conductor and has led a number of Canadian orchestras including those of Calgary, Edmonton, Kingston, National Arts Centre, Regina, Toronto, Thunder Bay, Vancouver, Victoria, and Winnipeg. Operatically, she has been on the faculty for Opera Nuova (Edmonton) for



15 seasons and has guest conducted Highlands Opera (Haliburton, Ontario), Opera Garden (Aberdeen, Scotland) and UBC Opera. She also conducted the world premiere of Yvette Nolan and Dean Burry's opera Shanawdithit for Tapestry Opera in Toronto, for which she received a Dora nomination for Music Direction in 2020. Ms. Thomson will make her Vancouver Opera debut in April 2022.

Ms. Thomson serves as a Regional Director for the Canadian Music Centre and is on the National Advocacy team for Orchestras Canada. Her work has been recognized with the Honour in the Arts Award through the Kelowna Civic and Community recognition program as well as the Okanagan Arts Awards in the Music category. In 2021 she received the Provincial Community Spirit award through the BC Spirit Foundation. Through her work with Opera Kelowna, Rosemary has recently been named as one of two national mentors for the Women in Musical Leadership initiative, a new program run by Tapestry Opera, Pacific Opera Victoria and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

Ms. Thomson is the subject of a new documentary film titled Shiny Objects: The Conductor with ADHD which is currently being shown at film festivals around the world.

egory—he is highly accomplished in so many fields: oboist, multi-instrumentalist, musical theatre actor, stuntman, choreographer, acrobat, soloist, chamber and orchestral musician, recording artist—and more. As the oboist with the award-winning ensemble Quartetto Gelato for over ten years, he has entertained audiences all over North America, as well as in Korea, Russia, Italy, China, the Bahamas, Mexico, the UK, and has been heard in radio broadcasts from Asia, South America, Australia and New Zealand, to South Africa and Europe.

For video game fans, Colin can be heard playing Musical Saw on the soundtrack for the upcoming video game *Cuphead 2*. Numbers from his CDs, *Advice From A Misguided Man* in 2012 and *The Fabulist* in 2014, are currently played on radio stations in over 20 countries.

Star turn moments include Colin's appearance as the "Devil Fiddler" in the Flying Blue Canoe for the Opening Ceremonies of the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics, combining his skill as a Cirque de Soleil acrobat with his musical prowess. He appeared as an actor in the Toronto Mirvish production of "Lord of the Rings," "KA" (Cirque du Soleil), "Amadeus" (Alberta Theatre Projects), "A Chorus Line" (StageWest), Sarah Brightman's World Tour, and on TV's "Honey I Shrunk the Kids!," amongst many others.

In 2002, Colin was a featured Jazz Oboist at the International Double Reed Festival. His school show for ages 6–12 incorporates his additional facility on clarinet, english horn, bassoon, violin, 5-string banjo, acoustic/electric bass, piano, saxophone, flute, guitar, mandolin and musical saw, showing off his unrivalled flair for good-humored entertainment of the highest order.



MATTI PULKKI GOT HIS FIRST ACCORDION and began his music studies at the age of six in the small town of Joutseno in eastern Finland. He grew up immersed in traditional Finnish music, old dance tunes, virtuosic showpieces and classical music, performing and competing on the accordion from an early age. He studied with the esteemed Finnish accordionist Matti Rantanan, eventually participating in numerous international masterclasses and seminars, including broadening his scope by studying in Canada with accordion master Joe Macerollo for a year in 2014. After earning his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Accordion Performance from the Sibelius Academy of the University of the Arts Helsinki, Matti returned to Canada in 2019, and is currently pursuing a doctorate at the University of Toronto.

Matti has performed internationally with numerous ensembles and as a soloist. He has also been involved with multiple theatre and opera productions both in Finland and Canada. Since his debut recital at the Helsinki Music Center in 2018, Matti has appeared on several international festivals. In his solo repertoire, he often concentrates on original classical contemporary works written for the free-bass accordion, collaborating closely with composers to expand and reimagine the possibilities of his instrument.

Outside the contemporary music scene, Matti is equally enthusiastic about arranging and performing music from a wide variety of styles and genres. His transcriptions of classical pieces range from Renaissance and Baroque keyboard music to twentieth century works. Enjoying a wide palette of styles and genres, he can often be heard performing music from tangos and klezmer to folk music and jazz, and everything in between.
